# Bill 115 Charter Challenge Update

We are getting there, really, we are! ETFO is working through the objections for the Bill 115 remedies. If you have filled out a Notice of Objection Form and have not heard back, please let the Local office know in January. Payouts are scheduled to be

made in May, 2023. While 2022 was the year we finally got a settlement, 2023 will finally be the year affected members will receive their settlement funds!

#### **Inclement Weather**

For information on what to do in the event of inclement weather, please consult Board Procedure 155 and the brochure on our website. Employees are responsible for their own safety when travelling to and from the work site. The Collective Agreement provides for nonattendance with pay "because of inclement weather, with timely notification to the appropriate supervisor or designate" (Article L30.02.10). In our district, weather conditions can vary greatly and change rapidly. It is up to you to decide if it is safe to travel. There is no requirement to report to the nearest school. If it is unsafe to travel to your home school, it may also be unsafe to travel anywhere. If you do decide that reporting to another school is safe, this arrangement should have been made in advance of the inclement weather season, and have the agreement of the administrators at the schools involved. If conditions improve during the day (e.g., the roads have been sanded and are now safe), then there is a reasonable expectation that you will report to work only if there is a reasonable amount of time left in the school day. If you are a part time teacher, your normal working hours are not to be altered or changed from the morning to the afternoon. If this has been suggested to you or imposed, please contact the local office. Please note that inclement weather coding can not be used for impending weather.

## **Local Bargaining**

As I hope you are aware, Central Bargaining is continuing at the provincial level as they work to set the Central Bargaining items. Locally, the Collective Bargaining Committee has completed a draft of our Preliminary Submission. The next step is to have our Preliminary Submission approved by ETFO. Once this occurs, we can begin the process of sharing it with our membership and bargaining locally. We will share developments with you as they occur.

## Failure to Fill Resulting in Lost Prep Time

The failure to fill vacancies has continued to create a loss of prep time for teachers in many of schools again this year. Due to the shortage of OTs and the chronic problem of unfilled vacancies that has been compounded by the amount of illness in our school communities, it continues to be essential that any lost prep time be tracked as to when it was lost and when it was paid back. Please report any lost prep time to your steward and principal, and ensure that it is being tracked! Missed prep time must be paid back "as soon as administratively feasible", but no later than two months, or the end of the school year, whichever comes first (Article L11.05.02). If you have lost prep and it has not been paid back within a two-month period, please let the Local Office know.

#### Winter Break Office Closure

The provincial office is currently closed for its annual two-week shutdown which started at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, December 16, and ends at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, January 2, 2023. The local office will be closed starting Thursday, December 22 at 4:00 pm and will re-open at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, January 9, 2023. During the closures from Friday, December 23 until January 2, 2023, ETFO's Emergency After Hours Legal Assistance system will respond to critical calls (e.g., allegations, OCT/CECE complaints, police/CAS contact). Staff in Professional Relations Services (PRS) will also continue to return critical calls within 24 hours. Non-critical calls to the provincial office will be responded to when their office re-opens. Emails and calls to the local office will be responded to when we return on Monday, January 9, 2023.

As we move into a new year, I would like to thank you for all the hard work that you have done so far this school year. We are happy to be back to in-person learning, well most of us, but it has not been without its own challenges. On behalf of Jason, Jane and myself, I would like to wish you a very well-deserved break! I hope you all enjoy a healthy and safe holiday!







# Festive Sign Workshop
