PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Cuts Hurt Kids



As I'm sure you are aware, the Progressive Conservative government of Doug Ford has recently announced more cuts to public education. Grade 4-8 class size averages will increase, the hiring process outlined in Reg 274 may be changed, and our OSSTF colleagues have been hit with dramatic increases in secondary class sizes. We anticipate that Ministry funding

to School Boards will begin to reflect those changes in this spring's staffing process. However, since our Collective Agreement contains language regarding class size, it seems clear that school boards will be expected to make up the shortfall with internal cuts. The impact on school budgets, support staff, and resources will be immediate.

As unwelcome as these cuts are, it is important to realize that lobbying on the part of ETFO and other education partners seems to have played a role in convincing the government not to alter the FDK model, or attempt to increase primary class size caps. Organizing efforts have also been effective in limiting changes to the Health and Physical Education curriculum.

ETFO is now running ads in regional newspapers and on billboards, criticizing the government for removing hundreds of millions of dollars from public education and making drastic changes

to funding for students with autism by downloading its obligation onto school boards and classroom

teachers in the near future.

Educators stand with parents and other community members to defend high-quality public education and the optimal learning conditions that all students need and deserve!

Our public education system needs investment not cuts.

The government has proposed changes that directly impact the upcoming round of negotiations. As with Bill 115, we can not stand by quietly as they undermine our collective agreements and bargaining rights.

On April 6th, there is an opportunity to speak out against cuts to public education. Please consider attending the rally at Queen's Park at noon. Buses are being organized locally by ETFO and OSSTE Members are encouraged to keep up the pressure by calling and writing their MPPs to let them know cuts to public education hurt kids.

Our Local will be hosting a half-day mobilization meeting with stewards on April 25th followed by the regular Stewards' meeting in the afternoon. All members will be asked to attend an in-school meeting regarding mobilization and the collective bargaining process very soon after April 25th. More information about those meetings will be forthcoming. A reminder that our Collective Agreement and the contract extension expire on August 31st.

Local Annual Meeting

Please find time in your busy schedule to attend the Local Annual Meeting at the Banquet Centre in Belleville (satellite meeting at York River) on April 25th at 5:00 p.m. This year we will be conducting elections for Committee Chairs and Secretary electronically for the first time. The Released Officers (president, vice-presidents and treasurer) will be entering the second year of a two-year term. Speeches from the Secretary and Committee Chair candidates will be delivered at the Annual Meeting with voting to follow afterward.

Elementary Spring Staffing Process

The Elementary Spring Staffing Process will soon be in full swing. School Administration placements are expected before the end of April, and teachers' "anticipated assignments" for 2019-20 should be known by May 14th. Members are reminded that **all Phase One, Two, and Mobility placements will be decided by the members of the Expanded Joint Staffing Committee with equal Board and Union representation.** If you are interested in a move, you might also want to investigate the possibility of a **Teacher Exchange**. Staffing details and timelines are posted on our Local website.


SOCIAL AND WELLNESS COMMITTEE
