PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Collective Agreement Ratified



Now that the 2014-2017 Collective Agreement has been ratified by both parties, both the Central and Local terms are now in effect. Central items such as the lump-sum payment and retroactive movement on the grid must be completed within 90 days of ratification. We are currently working with Human Resources on timelines, and the creation of a new document which will incorporate all

current language, negotiated items from 2012-13, new language from this round, and the Central items.

Highlights of the new Local Agreement include:

- A substantial revision of the staffing process language
- Improved provisions for the ETFO Health and Safety Officer
- Improved language for Mid-Year Transfers
- Improved language for Part-Time Increases
- Clarification of the Teacher Exchange process
- Improved language for unpaid leave (i.e. equalized deductions for pre-approved days similar to VLAP)
- Protection for ETFO members in the event of Interpanel Placements
- Commitment to investigate aligning Interpanel language with OSSTF
- Improved language for School Budget Committees
- Improved language concerning OT coverage for teacher absences
- Revisions to School Staffing Committee language to clarify roles and responsibilities
- Alignment of Coordinators and SETS terms with OSSTF (5 years)
- Improved language in the event there is a Recall List
- Commitment to review supervision guidelines for all schools
- Commitment to develop TIC training resources

An update on the new Collective Agreement will be provided to stewards at the **Stewards' Council meeting on April 28th**. Stewards will then be asked to hold meetings in schools throughout the remaining weeks of school as part of helping to educate members about the contract changes. The Released Officers will attend as many of these school-based meetings as possible.

Information on the movement to the new benefit package will be available after a Presidents' and Chief Negotiators' meeting on April 14th.

All members are invited to attend the Annual Meeting at The Banquet Centre on Thursday, April 28th at 5:00 p.m. Plans are underway for northern members to join the meeting electronically similar to the last few years. This is an **election year** for the President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer. Nominations are due by April $15^{\rm th}.$ Members will also be asked to approve constitutional changes and a draft budget for 2016-17.

The **spring staffing process** is about to get underway. The pilot process put in place two years ago is now permanent and will be reflected in the new Collective Agreement. The old "pink sheet and interview process" has been replaced with joint decision making between the Board and the Union regarding the placement of all teachers into vacancies. If you are looking for a move, or if you find that you are surplus to your school, please speak to your steward or call the Local Office at any time during the process.







ETFO supporting teachers with multiple resources to promote anti-racism



March 18, 2016

From the "Black Lives Matter" movement to Truth and Reconciliation, the Elementary Teachers' Federation of Ontario (ETFO) is providing teachers and Designated Early Childhood Educators (DECES) with multiple resources to ensure that curricula are inclusive and address anti-racism issues.

"We are responding to the need to do much more than just recognize the International Day for Elimination of Racial Discrimination on March 21st," said ETFO President Sam Hammond. "Whether it's the experience of African-Canadian, Black or First Nations, Métis and Inuit (FNMI) peoples or newcomers from Syria and other lands, we are striving to link today's issues with the history of individual, systemic and institutional racism in age-appropriate ways for our students."

In a current article in ETFO's member publication Voice, ETFO teacher and author Natasha Henry describes how she is working with teachers to incorporate African Canadian history throughout the year and across curriculum areas including science, history, geography and social studies. In 2015, ETFO launched groundbreaking workshops on Re-Thinking White Privilege, and is bringing racialized members together this April for a conference focused on challenging oppression.

ETFO is also working to link the residential school revelations and recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission with culturally relevant and authentic content on FNMI history, culture and issues for classrooms.
