PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Staffing

The Elementary Spring Staffing Process has begun. The Joint Staffing Committee met to review enrollment, special education staffing, and central coordinator roles. Unfortunately, due to fewer central roles, an increase in the number of teaching administrators, the number of retirements and

leaves, and less transition time, 17 teachers were declared Surplus to the System. After a week-long delay, known school administration placements were announced on May 5. Teachers' "anticipated assignments" for 2023-2024 should have been known prior to May 19th, the revised first day of the 17-day process. Members are reminded that all Phase One, Two, and Mobility placements will be decided by the members of the Expanded Joint Staffing Committee (EJSC) with equal Board and Union representation. The members of the ETFO EJSC are Sarah MacKay, Jason Surgent, Jane Scanlan-Price, Justine Bucknell, and Amira Loney. If you are interested in a move, you might also want to investigate the possibility of a Teacher Exchange. Staffing details and timelines are posted on our Local website.

Central Bargaining Update

ETFO's Central Bargaining continues albeit slowly. On Tuesday, May 23, Provincial ETFO President Karen

Brown addressed the Local Executive, Stewards and additional local members regarding central bargaining. Each steward will be holding, or may already have held, a meeting of ETFO members at their school to discuss the issues taking place at the central table that were discussed at this meeting. Local Bargaining Update

On April 13, 2023, the Local held a Preliminary Submission Presentation meeting followed by a ratification vote. The vote was 100% in favour of approving our Preliminary Submission. The Board was notified that we were ready to begin Local Negotiations on April 17. Our first bargaining date has been set for June 21, 2023.

The \$20 is tax deductible, but if you do not wish to contribute, you should complete the form in Part B on page 151 of the Collective Agreement and submit to HR prior to the processing of the first pay of the new school year.

LTD

Under the terms of the LTD policy, if you have reached your 85 factor and have 30 or more years of credited service, you are no longer eligible for LTD. Please contact the Local office to enquire about discontinuing premiums.

Pay Periods for 2023-2024

After two years of 27 pay periods, we will be going back to 26 pays in 2023-2024. The first pay period of the 2023-2024 school year is September 8, 2023.




ETFO-HPE
