## **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:**



Welcome back to a new school year to all ETFO members. As we are now in our second year without a contract, you can expect to hear a lot more about negotiations as the year progresses. Our current government continues to disregard the needs of elementary education and their disrespect for elementary teachers is

obvious. ETFO remains committed to bargaining for a fair and respectful deal!

#### Strike Vote

On Tuesday, October 26 at the Empire Theatre, ETFO First Vice-President David Mastin and our CB liaison Derek Hulse gave an overview of the Collective Bargaining process, updated members on the current central talks and urged solidarity in the face of a government determined on cuts and minimal pay increases. #### Local Collective Bargaining

The Local Bargaining team consists of Lead Negotiator Amira Loney, Sarah MacKay, Jason Surgent, Jane Scanlan Price, Justine Bucknell, Derek Watt and provincial CB liaison Derek Hulse. Local collective bargaining has begun. Our first bargaining date was on June 21, 2023. Our second bargaining date was September 28, 2023, and we will continue bargaining with dates in October.

#### September Enrolment Imbalances

The Joint Staffing Committee met and made recommendations for school reorganizations. Decision-making is guided by several provisions in the Collective Agreement (school staffing averages and Grade 4-8 system-wide averages), and well as Ministry Regulations (a Kindergarten at cap, primary class size caps of 20, etc.), and some flexibility for school-based decisions which can be achieved within the CA and Ministry requirements. Enrolment decreased by 98 students this year. Unfortunately, this meant some higher classes sizes (yet still in compliance with Ministry Regulations) in 7 of our FDK classes and several junior and intermediate classes. There was one school that decreased in staff and only two that increased. Currently there is only one position left unfilled in one of our northern schools and all other moves/reorganizations have been completed.

#### LTD

Under the terms of the LTD policy, if you have reached your 85 factor and have 30 or more years of credited service, you are no longer eligible for LTD. Please contact the Local office to enquire about discontinuing premiums.

#### Pay Periods for 2023-2024

The first pay for the 2023-2024 school year was on September 8, 2023. While it may have looked like there was a pay raise for everyone, the difference in pay is the result of going back to 26 pay periods for the 2023-2023 school year. Please be sure to monitor your pay "stubs" in myEmpath to ensure you are being paid the correct salary. If there are any discrepancies please contact the Local office as soon as possible.


